

# Characteristics of Legal Rights

## **Every right involves a threefold relation in which the owner of it stands:**

- I. It is a right against some person or persons.
- II. It is a right to some act or omission of such person or persons.
- III. It is a right over to some thing to which that act or omission relates.

## Note-

- Ownerless rights are not recognised by English law.
- This is because, there would be nothing to prevent such a concept being used in legal reasoning.
- Ownership of a right may be merely contingent or uncertain.
- The owner of it may be a person indeterminate.
