Characteristics of Legal Rights

Every right involves a threefold relation in which the owner of it stands:

I. It is a right against some person or persons.

II.It is a right to some act or omission of such person or persons.

III.It is a right over to some thing to which that act or omission relates.

Note-

- Ownerless rights are not recognised by English law.
- This is because, there would be nothing to prevent such a concept being used in legal reasoning.
- Ownership of a right may be merely contingent or uncertain.
- The owner of it may be a person indeterminate.
